



Maternal and Child Health Program

Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

WIC is a supplemental nutrition, education and health assessment program for pregnant and breastfeeding women, infants and children up to age five who meet eligibility requirements.

Family Case management (FCM)

Services including home visits, are available to pregnant women, infants and children within age requirements who meet financial eligibility. Family Case Management staff also carry out responsibilities for the High-Risk Infant Follow-Up/Adverse Pregnancy Outcome Reporting system (APORS) and Medical Case Management (HealthWorks of Illinois) for children age 6 in foster care through the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS).

Lead Screening

Screening, Follow-up and referrals are provided for children ages 1 year to 5 years and at-risk pregnant women, who are enrolled in MCH programs. Individual of all ages who are potentially at risk or if referred by a physician may be screened. Those with abnormal lead levels are case managed and home visits are conducted to help determine possible cause of high lead levels. Education and resources are offered until lead levels return to normal.

Other Public Health Programs

Immunizations

The department is a provider for adult and childhood vaccines and is a VFC (Vaccine for Children) provider.

Laboratory Services

Laboratory services are offered, with doctor's order, by appointment. Tests available without a doctor's order, on the first Thursday of the month, include PSA and Lipid. Provider required for results to be sent to.

Communicable Disease

Integral components are surveillance, investigations, reporting and follow-up to prevent the spread of communicable disease.

Tuberculosis Program

The department provides TB Skin Testing

Drug Screening and Breath Alcohol Testing

The department performs DOT and Non-DOT drug screening and breath alcohol testing for consortium and non-consortium members.

Appointments are required.

Behavioral Health Program

Proudly serving the area since 1988, Jasper County Health Department – Behavioral Health (JCHD-BH), offers a variety of behavioral health services with qualified staff members in the behavioral health division. Experienced staff help children, adolescents and adults with emotional difficulties, mental illness and addiction.

Services are tailored to each person's individual need. All ages, All concerns. Including but not limited to individual, group and family therapy. Services are provided in office as well as other location in the community as appropriate.

Services we offer include: outpatient mental health treatment, addiction treatment (substance and gambling), psychiatric treatment, DUI/risk education, divorcing parents' program, crisis intervention, case management, outreach, follow-up care, referrals and speaker's bureau. Treatment approaches include a variety of trauma informed, evidence-based models of care.

We are Medicaid certified and mental health programs are CARF Accredited. JCHD-BH is licensed by and funded in part by Illinois Department of Human Services, Division of Mental Health and Division of Substance Use Prevention and Recovery. Medicaid and private insurance are accepted. Some fees are based on an adjusted fee share, determined by household income and family size, except where otherwise indicated. (Donations are welcomed and taxexempt status information will be provided to all contributors.

Emergency Preparedness

Prepares and executes emergency response/disaster plans for the department to respond appropriately during natural, technological and intentionally caused emergency events including disease outbreaks, bioterrorism, floods, severe weather, environmental crises, food protection incidents and other community events impacting health and safety.

Environmental Health

To minimize the risk of food-borne illnesses, the department provides inspections and licensing of food service establishments. All permanent and temporary facilities must have a permit from the Jasper County Health Department to operate including mobile food trucks and specific events.

Consultation is available to homeowners and licensed contractors regarding private sewage disposal systems and water wells. Permits are issued for new private sewage disposal systems and repair as well as private water wells and closed loop wells. Interpretation of results from well water sampling is available. Investigations of environmental sanitation complains are also completed.

The Vector Surveillance Program for mosquito and bird testing is also managed by the department.
